Doing God's Work

Joshua and Caleb were excited when they came back from the Promised Land. They didn't let the other spies get them down. Instead of seeing problems, they saw the land from God's point of view. To do God's work, you need to see the world the way God sees it. Ask God to help you look at your life with new eyes.

Your Challenge:

This week spy out a "secret mission" for God. Do something kind for someone else, but don't tell anyone your plans. You could do an extra chore at home without being asked. Or, you could make a card with a Bible verse for a friend who's feeling down, and put it on their desk when they're not looking. Watch how the other person reacts to the deed of kindness. Then, thank God for the blessing of doing His work.

Doing God's Work

Ten of Moses' spies saw the problems, but Joshua and Caleb chose to see the promised land through Heaven's eyes. They thanked God for the new land's blessings and trusted Him for help with the problems. When you look at your life, what do you see? Only problems, or lots of promise? Learn to spy out the blessings God has given you. Look for chances to serve Him.

Your Challenge:

Find someone in your community to see through Heaven's eyes. Maybe you know someone who has a disability. Ask God to help you see them the way He does. Don't think about what they can't do...thank God for what they can do. Or, maybe you know someone who's not well liked by the other kids in school. Ask God to show you something good about them—then tell them! It will be exciting to see how God blesses others through you.
